

Matthew 28:1-15	Mark 16:1-13
<p>1 Now after the Sabbath, as it began to dawn toward the first <i>day</i> of the week, Mary Magdalene and the other Mary came to look at the grave.</p> <p>2 And behold, a severe earthquake had occurred, for an angel of the Lord descended from heaven and came and rolled away the stone and sat upon it.</p> <p>3 And his appearance was like lightning, and his clothing as white as snow.</p> <p>4 The guards shook for fear of him and became like dead men.</p> <p>5 The angel said to the women, "Do not be afraid; for I know that you are looking for Jesus who has been crucified.</p> <p>6 "He is not here, for He has risen, just as He said. Come, see the place where He was lying.</p> <p>7 "Go quickly and tell His disciples that He has risen from the dead; and behold, He is going ahead of you into Galilee, there you will see Him; behold, I have told you."</p> <p>8 And they left the tomb quickly with fear and great joy and ran to report it to His disciples.</p> <p>9 And behold, Jesus met them and greeted them. And they came up and took hold of His feet and worshiped Him.</p> <p>10 Then Jesus <i>*said</i> to them, "Do not be afraid; go and take word to My brethren to leave for Galilee, and there they will see Me."</p> <p>11 Now while they were on their way, some of the guard came into the city and reported to the chief priests all that had happened.</p> <p>12 And when they had assembled with the elders and consulted together, they gave a large sum of money to the soldiers,</p> <p>13 and said, "You are to say, 'His disciples came by night and stole Him away while we were asleep.'</p> <p>14 "And if this should come to the governor's ears, we will win him over and keep you out of trouble."</p> <p>15 And they took the money and did as they had been instructed; and this story was widely spread among the Jews, <i>and is</i> to this day.</p>	<p>1 When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the <i>mother</i> of James, and Salome, bought spices, so that they might come and anoint Him.</p> <p>2 Very early on the first day of the week, they <i>*came</i> to the tomb when the sun had risen.</p> <p>3 They were saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance of the tomb?"</p> <p>4 Looking up, they <i>*saw</i> that the stone had been rolled away, although it was extremely large.</p> <p>5 Entering the tomb, they saw a young man sitting at the right, wearing a white robe; and they were amazed.</p> <p>6 And he <i>*said</i> to them, "Do not be amazed; you are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, who has been crucified. He has risen; He is not here; behold, <i>here is</i> the place where they laid Him.</p> <p>7 "But go, tell His disciples and Peter, 'He is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see Him, just as He told you.'"</p> <p>8 They went out and fled from the tomb, for trembling and astonishment had gripped them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid.</p> <p>9 [Now after He had risen early on the first day of the week, He first appeared to Mary Magdalene, from whom He had cast out seven demons.</p> <p>10 She went and reported to those who had been with Him, while they were mourning and weeping.</p> <p>11 When they heard that He was alive and had been seen by her, they refused to believe it.</p> <p>12 After that, He appeared in a different form to two of them while they were walking along on their way to the country.</p> <p>13 They went away and reported it to the others, but they did not believe them either.</p>

Luke 24:1-49	John 20:1-29
<p>1 But on the first day of the week, at early dawn, they came to the tomb bringing the spices which they had prepared.</p> <p>2 And they found the stone rolled away from the tomb,</p> <p>3 but when they entered, they did not find the body of the Lord Jesus.</p> <p>4 While they were perplexed about this, behold, two men suddenly stood near them in dazzling clothing;</p> <p>5 and as <i>the women</i> were terrified and bowed their faces to the ground, <i>the men</i> said to them, "Why do you seek the living One among the dead?"</p> <p>6 "He is not here, but He has risen. Remember how He spoke to you while He was still in Galilee,</p> <p>7 saying that the Son of Man must be delivered into the hands of sinful men, and be crucified, and the third day rise again."</p> <p>8 And they remembered His words,</p> <p>9 and returned from the tomb and reported all these things to the eleven and to all the rest.</p> <p>10 Now they were Mary Magdalene and Joanna and Mary the <i>mother</i> of James; also the other women with them were telling these things to the apostles.</p> <p>11 But these words appeared to them as nonsense, and they would not believe them.</p> <p>12 But Peter got up and ran to the tomb; stooping and looking in, he <i>saw</i> the linen wrappings only; and he went away to his home, marveling at what had happened.</p> <p>13 And behold, two of them were going that very day to a village named Emmaus, which was about seven miles from Jerusalem.</p> <p>14 And they were talking with each other about all these things which had taken place.</p> <p>15 While they were talking and discussing, Jesus Himself approached and <i>began</i> traveling with them.</p> <p>16 But their eyes were prevented from recognizing Him.</p> <p>17 And He said to them, "What are these words that you are exchanging with one another as you are walking?" And they stood still, looking sad.</p> <p>18 One of <i>them</i>, named Cleopas, answered and said to Him, "Are You the only one visiting Jerusalem and unaware of the things which have happened here in these days?"</p> <p>19 And He said to them, "What things?" And they said to Him, "The things about Jesus the Nazarene, who was a prophet mighty in deed and word in the sight of God and all the people,</p> <p>20 and how the chief priests and our rulers delivered Him to the sentence of death, and crucified Him.</p> <p>21 "But we were hoping that it was He who was going to redeem Israel. Indeed, besides all this, it is the third day since these things happened.</p> <p>22 "But also some women among us amazed us. When they were at the tomb early in the morning,</p> <p>23 and did not find His body, they came, saying that they had also seen a vision of angels who said that He was alive.</p> <p>24 "Some of those who were with us went to the tomb and found it just exactly as the women also had said; but Him they did not see."</p>	<p>1 Now on the first day of the week Mary Magdalene <i>came</i> early to the tomb, while it <i>was</i> still dark, and <i>saw</i> the stone <i>already</i> taken away from the tomb.</p> <p>2 So she <i>ran</i> and <i>came</i> to Simon Peter and to the other disciple whom Jesus loved, and <i>said</i> to them, "They have taken away the Lord out of the tomb, and we do not know where they have laid Him."</p> <p>3 So Peter and the other disciple went forth, and they were going to the tomb.</p> <p>4 The two were running together; and the other disciple ran ahead faster than Peter and came to the tomb first;</p> <p>5 and stooping and looking in, he <i>saw</i> the linen wrappings lying <i>there</i>; but he did not go in.</p> <p>6 And so Simon Peter also <i>came</i>, following him, and entered the tomb; and he <i>saw</i> the linen wrappings lying <i>there</i>,</p> <p>7 and the face-cloth which had been on His head, not lying with the linen wrappings, but rolled up in a place by itself.</p> <p>8 So the other disciple who had first come to the tomb then also entered, and he saw and believed.</p> <p>9 For as yet they did not understand the Scripture, that He must rise again from the dead.</p> <p>10 So the disciples went away again to their own homes.</p> <p>11 But Mary was standing outside the tomb weeping; and so, as she wept, she stooped and looked into the tomb;</p> <p>12 and she <i>saw</i> two angels in white sitting, one at the head and one at the feet, where the body of Jesus had been lying.</p> <p>13 And they <i>said</i> to her, "Woman, why are you weeping?" She <i>said</i> to them, "Because they have taken away my Lord, and I do not know where they have laid Him."</p> <p>14 When she had said this, she turned around and <i>saw</i> Jesus standing <i>there</i>, and did not know that it was Jesus.</p> <p>15 Jesus <i>said</i> to her, "Woman, why are you weeping? Whom are you seeking?" Supposing Him to be the gardener, she <i>said</i> to Him, "Sir, if you have carried Him away, tell me where you have laid Him, and I will take Him away."</p>

**Luke 24:25** And He said to them, "O foolish men and slow of heart to believe in all that the prophets have spoken!

**26** "Was it not necessary for the Christ to suffer these things and to enter into His glory?"

**27** Then beginning with Moses and with all the prophets, He explained to them the things concerning Himself in all the Scriptures.

**28** And they approached the village where they were going, and He acted as though He were going farther.

**29** But they urged Him, saying, "Stay with us, for it is *getting* toward evening, and the day is now nearly over." So He went in to stay with them.

**30** When He had reclined *at the table* with them, He took the bread and blessed *it*, and breaking *it*, He *began* giving *it* to them.

**31** Then their eyes were opened and they recognized Him; and He vanished from their sight.

**32** They said to one another, "Were not our hearts burning within us while He was speaking to us on the road, while He was explaining the Scriptures to us?"

**33** And they got up that very hour and returned to Jerusalem, and found gathered together the eleven and those who were with them,

**34** saying, "The Lord has really risen and has appeared to Simon."

**35** They *began* to relate their experiences on the road and how He was recognized by them in the breaking of the bread.

**36** While they were telling these things, He Himself stood in their midst and *said* to them, "Peace be to you."

**37** But they were startled and frightened and thought that they were seeing a spirit.

**38** And He said to them, "Why are you troubled, and why do doubts arise in your hearts?"

**39** "See My hands and My feet, that it is I Myself; touch Me and see, for a spirit does not have flesh and bones as you see that I have."

**40** And when He had said this, He showed them His hands and His feet.

**41** While they still could not believe *it* because of their joy and amazement, He said to them, "Have you anything here to eat?"

**42** They gave Him a piece of a broiled fish;

**43** and He took it and ate *it* before them.

**44** Now He said to them, "These are My words which I spoke to you while I was still with you, that all things which are written about Me in the Law of Moses and the Prophets and the Psalms must be fulfilled."

**45** Then He opened their minds to understand the Scriptures,

**46** and He said to them, "Thus it is written, that the Christ would suffer and rise again from the dead the third day,

**47** and that repentance for forgiveness of sins would be proclaimed in His name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem.

**48** "You are witnesses of these things.

**49** And behold, I am sending forth the promise of My Father upon you; but you are to stay in the city until you are clothed with power from on high."

**John 20:16** Jesus said to her, "Mary!" She turned and said to Him in Hebrew, "Rabboni!" (which means, Teacher).

**17** Jesus *said* to her, "Stop clinging to Me, for I have not yet ascended to the Father; but go to My brethren and say to them, 'I ascend to My Father and your Father, and My God and your God.'"

**18** Mary Magdalene *came*, announcing to the disciples, "I have seen the Lord," and *that* He had said these things to her.

**19** So when it was evening on that day, the first *day* of the week, and when the doors were shut where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood in their midst and *said* to them, "Peace *be* with you."

**20** And when He had said this, He showed them both His hands and His side. The disciples then rejoiced when they saw the Lord.

**21** So Jesus said to them again, "Peace *be* with you; as the Father has sent Me, I also send you."

**22** And when He had said this, He breathed on them and *said* to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit.

**23** "If you forgive the sins of any, *their sins* have been forgiven them; if you retain the *sins* of any, they have been retained."

**24** But Thomas, one of the twelve, called Didymus, was not with them when Jesus came.

**25** So the other disciples were saying to him, "We have seen the Lord!" But he said to them, "Unless I see in His hands the imprint of the nails, and put my finger into the place of the nails, and put my hand into His side, I will not believe."

**26** After eight days His disciples were again inside, and Thomas with them. Jesus *came*, the doors having been shut, and stood in their midst and said, "Peace *be* with you."

**27** Then He *said* to Thomas, "Reach here with your finger, and see My hands; and reach here your hand and put it into My side; and do not be unbelieving, but believing."

**28** Thomas answered and said to Him, "My Lord and my God!"

**29** Jesus *said* to him, "Because you have seen Me, have you believed? Blessed *are* they who did not see, and *yet* believed."
